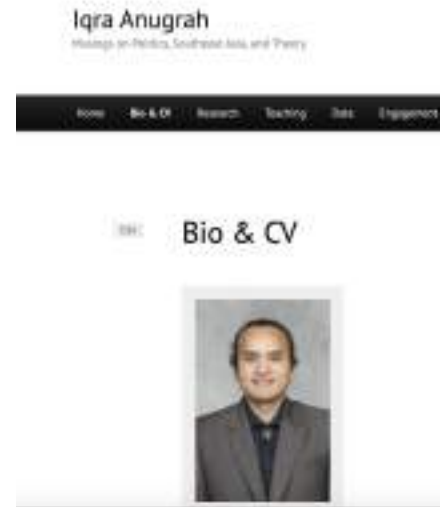

Results	Describes what was discovered
Discussion	Discusses the implications of the findings

Appendices (some journals)	Provides supplemental data for the expert reader

Impact Metrics

The following citation metrics are produced by abstracting and indexing databases using their respective datasets. These metrics represent a variety of methods for measuring the citation impact of published research on a journal level.

Scopus

CiteScore

Scopus provides the journal's CiteScore, which is calculated as the total citations made in the CiteScore year and the prior three years to content published in the CiteScore year and the prior three years, divided by the total number of items published by the journal in the CiteScore year and prior three years.

Source-normalized Impact per Paper (SNIP)

1.307

SNIP calculates a journal's average citations from the SNIP year to items published in the prior three years, and divides the average by the citation potential in the journal's subject area to account for variability between subject categories.

SCImago Journal Rank (SJR)

0.454

Political Science and International Relations 154 out of 573 | Sociology and Political Science 402 out of 1315

The SJR weighs incoming citations according to the prestige of the publications they come from. Total, weighted citations made in the SCImago year to content published in a journal in the prior three years are divided by the total number of items published by the journal in the prior three years.

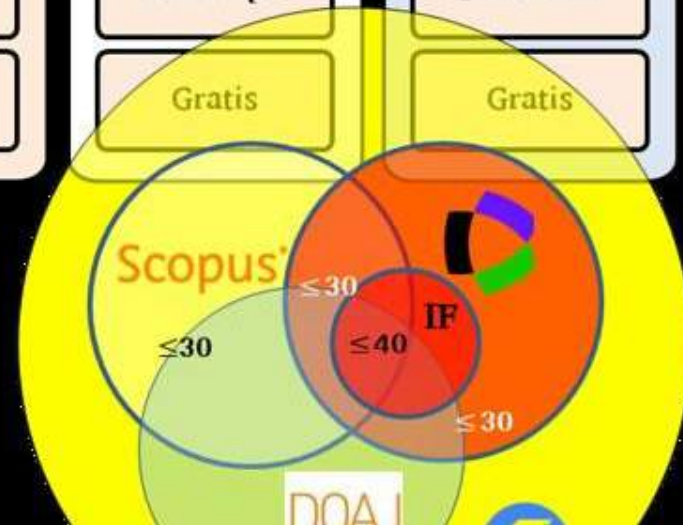

How a local MP fights against mining interests

Intro

- Hook: a local activist in Kaltim who made a comment about how the local politicians benefit from the mining industry when he and I were riding a motorcycle across the city of Samarinda.
- A brief and general introduction about the collusive relationship between local politicians and mining interests in resource-rich provinces in Indonesia such as Kalimantan Timur (Kaltim).
 - But I found an outlier: Baharuddin Demmu, a local MP at DPRD Provinsi Kaltim from PAN who used to be an anti-mining activist. He is a rare example of a politician who opposes mining interests openly in the local parliament and work closely with his constituencies.
- My argument: This MP is a rare example of how activists and marginalised citizens can utilise post-decentralisation political space to provide check and balance to the mining interests. However, his influence remains limited – he needs more mass support and other allies in the parliament.

Body

- Context: how mining interests influence politics in post-authoritarian Indonesia – e.g. in existing regulations and electoral politics (e.g. national politics and golkade elections) and their socio-ecological impacts on rural communities
- Explain a bit about the local context in Kaltim – same points as above, with an emphasis on the close connection between local politicians and mining interests (how pervasive it is).
- Introducing Baharuddin Demmu – his background, his activist and political career, and his track record so far.
- What people think about him – his activist colleagues and voters.
 - He doesn't buy votes – instead he actually goes to his constituencies, explains the kind of government programs and facilities available to his voters, and
 - Significance
- The kind of challenges that he faces and his achievements so far.
- My critical analysis of his career.
- Another critical analysis of his future challenges and political prospect

Contoh outline

Untuk artikel di *New Mandala*

- Situating his mining advocacy effort within the broader struggle against mining interests in Kaltim and nationally (and how one should not forget the influence/role of this broader struggle in civil society) and its limits.

Conclusion

- The tale of Baharuddin Demmu as a rare example of a local politician who fights against mining interests and represents the interests of rural citizens.
- However, the influence of mining interests remains pervasive, indicating the limitation of his political advocacy and the work of civil society actors and how, at the national level, mining advocacy remains a niche issue.
- For a major policy change on mining to occur, civil society needs more people like Baharuddin Demmu in the parliament and more advocacy efforts.

Again, on note taking (C. Wright Mills, 1959)

- “In this file, you, as an intellectual craftsman, will try to get together what you are doing intellectually and what you are experiencing as a person... [Your file] also encourages you to capture ‘fringe-thoughts’: various ideas which may be by-products of everyday life, snatches of conversation overheard on the street, or, for that matter, dreams. Once noted, these may lead to more systematic thinking, as well as lend intellectual relevance to more directed experience.”
- **“By keeping an adequate file and thus developing self-reflective habits, you learn how to keep your inner world awake.”**
- “The file also helps you build up the habit of writing. You cannot ‘keep your hand in’ if you do not write something at least every week.”
